

KEEP A CLEAN CAMP

Store all food, garbage, or smelly items so that bears cannot access them. Ravens sometimes open containers or bags and scatter the contents. The following items should be properly stored when not in use (even if clean and empty):



**Food and condiments
(even if in containers)**



**Cosmetics and
toiletries**



Garbage



**Cooking or eating
utensils (please, no
cooking in your
tent!)**



**Pet food and
bowls**



**Water and
beverage
containers**



Coolers and ice chests

**Do not store these items in
tents or truck beds!**

It should be no surprise that bears have always been a natural part of Bear Valley and they still are today: play a role in their continued protection by keeping your food away from them and your glamping tent.



Bears are smart and learn new food sources quickly. Allowing bears to obtain human food even once often leads to them becoming aggressive toward people when they come back looking for more. Aggressive bears threaten human safety and eventually must be removed from the park or killed.

WHERE CAN I STORE THESE ITEMS?

Store these items in vehicles or the bear-proof storage lockers available at the glampground comfort station/check-in.

Pick up food scraps or garbage that fell to the ground. A small plastic trash bag should be amongst the items you received when you checked-in. If not, or if you need additional bags, please see your camp host. Trash bags with items in them should not be stored in your tent. Place them in the community trash container(s) at the end of the glampground near the check-in office.
